

### December 4<sup>th</sup> Lighting of the Trees!!!

We would like to have groups, organizations, churches, etc. participate by decorating an evergreen that will be placed in Ward Park. Please sign up by November 25<sup>th</sup> if you would like to participate so tree locations can be mapped out. We will give out trees on a first come basis. Trees will be set in the park by November 30<sup>th</sup> and can be decorated through Dec 3<sup>rd</sup>. There will be a sign provided for each tree to indicate your group. Electricity will be provided to light your tree.

### Change your Clocks/ Change your Batteries

Don't forget that at 2 a.m. on Sunday, November 1st, you will need to turn your clocks back one hour, marking the end of Daylight Saving Time (DST).

A fire can double in size every 30 seconds. The sound of the alarm will give you and your family those few extra seconds to get out and stay out of your home.

The Office of the Fire Marshal also recommends that one of the simplest things you can do to protect your family is changing the batteries in your smoke alarms/detectors and carbon monoxide detectors at the same time.
