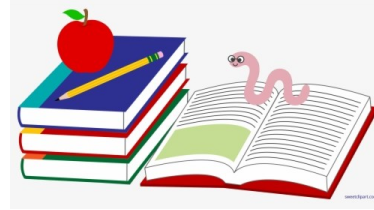

Mayor's Message

Thank you for your understanding of the shutdown of the village office and meetings from Sept. 8 -14, and for the calls of concern. The Genesee County Health Department worked with us in following the necessary protocols for everyone's safety. Special thanks to Rene Vurraro and Barb Zinter for all their help!

A draft dated September 2, 2021, for the Bergen Zoning Code has been posted on the village website; the draft reflects the public comments of the three public hearings. The next step in the process will be a review by the Genesee County Planning Board.

Grippio Asphalt did a great job sealcoating and marking the village parking lots and basketball courts; the sealcoating process protects and prolongs the life expectancy of asphalt pavement. Our staff will be marking parking spaces in the business district as recommended by the DOT. New parking signs provided by the county will be installed.

Projects that were part of the Main Street Program have been completed; the work has provided for the renovation of two and the addition of three new apartments, and the addition of five new businesses to our Main Street. Façade restoration, new signs, parking lot upgrades, new planters, façade lighting, and more were made possible by the grant. This could not have happened without the commitment of the property owners to our village. Thank you to all the participants, and especially to Mike Cocquyt of Labella and Associates, for their efforts throughout the process. You have been great to work with!

Fall is upon us, and a community event is in the works to usher in the season. Libby Piper and her mom Heather Painting approached me about working together on a fall event for the community, and the planning took off from there. Save the date of October 22 from 6 – 10 pm for the "Bergen Octoberfest" with a ghost tour, food trucks, music, and more. 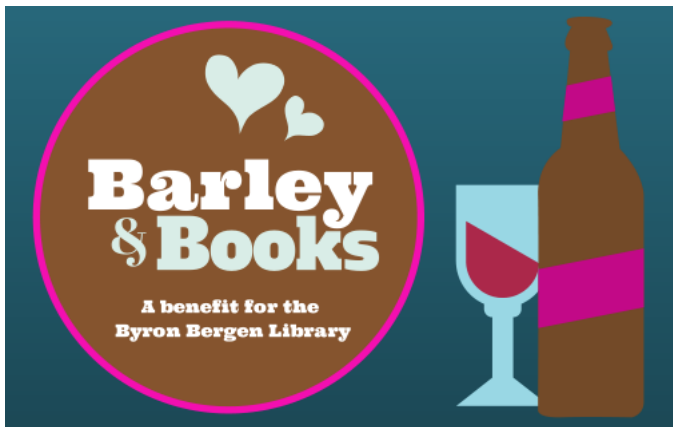
