## From the Desk of the Village Historian, Vicky Truax

Today's story takes us to a home built for Dr. Bernard Puglisi, in 1941 located at 68 Rochester Street. This lovely home is now owned by the Garnish's. The property had two acres of land which included frontage on Munger Street. Dr. Puglisi was Bergen's family doctor for many of us locals. The house was originally built with Dr. Puglisi's doctor's office attached to the west side of the Rochester Street home. In this way, the Puglisi family lived there, and the doctor could conveniently run his medical practice. In 1946, Mary wanted the family to move back to Rochester, so that her children could attend Catholic schools. With a heavy heart, the Puglisi's sold the home and the doctor's office was detached and moved to 57 Munger Street. After the office was moved in 1946, the doctor planted 100's of pine trees, between Munger Street and the Rochester Street home, to obscure his view of the house on Rochester Street that he so loved. Dr. Puglisi ran his medical practice from Munger Street, from 1946 until his death in 1989. He commuted from Rochester to his office in Bergen for 43 years. 57 Munger Street is now Tom and Ellen Taylor's home.

In Dr. Puglisi's obituary, he was remembered for maintaining the qualities of a small-town doctor in his practice, and for making house calls. Dr. Puglisi became specialized in arthritis and allergies, in his later years of practice. The good Doctor prepared proprietary medications, contained in small glass bottles with a cork on top, for some of the locals. Harris Wilcox was a friend of the doctor for over 50 years. "Dr. Puglisi was a little bit ahead of his time", said Harris Wilcox.

Thanks to Ralph Garnish for his many details and documents to help write this story. The Garnish's are the fourth owners of their home.
