Today's story is of long-time resident Donald Coleman. Don was born on 11/3/1949 and passed away on 8/23/2019. Don grew up in Minetto, NY. After high school he attended West Virginia Wesleyan college because he wanted to get away from the snow. At college, Don studied Sociology, Psychology and Old Testament majors. He wanted to be a police officer at the time. While at college, he met his wife, Debra. Don graduated college and he and Deb were married, on 7/15/1972. Deb transferred to Roberts Wesleyan and Don went to work with his father selling electric baseboard heat. Shortly after, they found Bergen and they knew they had found their forever hometown. They lived on Munger Street and raised their four daughters.

Don joined the fire department and rescue squad. The family also found the Bergen United Methodist Church where Don wore several hats, from youth group leader to board member to ticket seller at the chicken barbecues. Don had grown up as an independent thinker who bragged that he had been thrown out of everything he joined starting with kindergarten. He bonded with folks who found themselves in a tough situation. He respected all people, no matter what was going on in their lives.

Don became coroner for Genesee County and served from 1992 – 2019. It takes a special person to be coroner. He was honored to serve the people of his community. He is remembered for his professionalism and kindness. He was very empathetic and could bring caring and humor into difficult situations. So many of Don's colleagues came together to help after Barry Miller died, and then when Don was sick.

His youngest daughter Sandy now lives in the family homestead and followed in her dad's footsteps. She is a medic and firefighter here in Bergen. December seemed a fitting month to run a story on such a giving man. Bergen is a better place because of Don Coleman.

Please remember that there is no parking on Village streets between 2:00am and 7:00am and no parking across the sidewalks at any time. Your assistance will help our crews in their efforts to keep our roads clean and safe during the winter months. Vehicles that remain parked on the street between these hours will be towed at the owner's expense.

We will do our best to keep streets and sidewalks safe during snow and ice conditions. If you believe you have an unsafe situation, please contact the office at 494-1513 and we will do our best to resolve the problem as quickly as possible.

Property owners and snow removal contractors should be aware that shoveling or plowing snow from private property onto or across public roads is illegal because it can present a serious traffic hazard to motorists.

Customers must keep the approach to their mailboxes clear of obstructions to allow safe access for delivery. If USPS employees are impeded in reaching a mail receptacle, the postmaster may withdraw delivery service.

On-street parking on Lake Avenue is limited to 2 hours at all times and there is no overnight parking allowed.
