### From the Desk of the Village Historian, Vicky Truax

Today's story is from December 8, 1898, in the Batavia Daily News

#### Great Storm At An End

If the man who predicted an open winter has not already crawled under a snowbank he should do so as quickly as he can. With more snow on the ground than has been seen in years, Batavians are in a frame of mind to deal roughly with false prophets. The individual who writes about the beautiful snow should get ready to dodge every time he sees a man with a snow shovel.

Men who have lived long hereabouts aver that they have never seen higher individual drifts, but all agree that they have never gazed upon such a volume of snow so comparatively evenly distributed. It is the unanimous verdict, furthermore, that the skies never emptied so much whiteness on the parent town of the Holland Purchase within such a brief space of time as it has in this instance. No one ever saw it snow faster than it did yesterday afternoon. Beyond a doubt it was as great a storm as ever imposed upon this section . There are very few places, where the snow is undisturbed, where it wouldn't be necessary to dig down at least three feet to reach dirt. When it finally stopped snowing late yesterday afternoon the business portions of Main, Jackson, and State Streets resembled rivers disturbed by a tempest. The snow had been drifted by the wind into the form of great waves, which were pretty to look upon, but anything but pleasant to wade through.

The only redeeming feature of the storm was the fact that it was not accompanied by severe cold. At no time during the day yesterday did it get below 20 degrees.

Many of us complain about winter, but we have been lucky this year. We know that spring is right around the corner. For that we are thankful.
